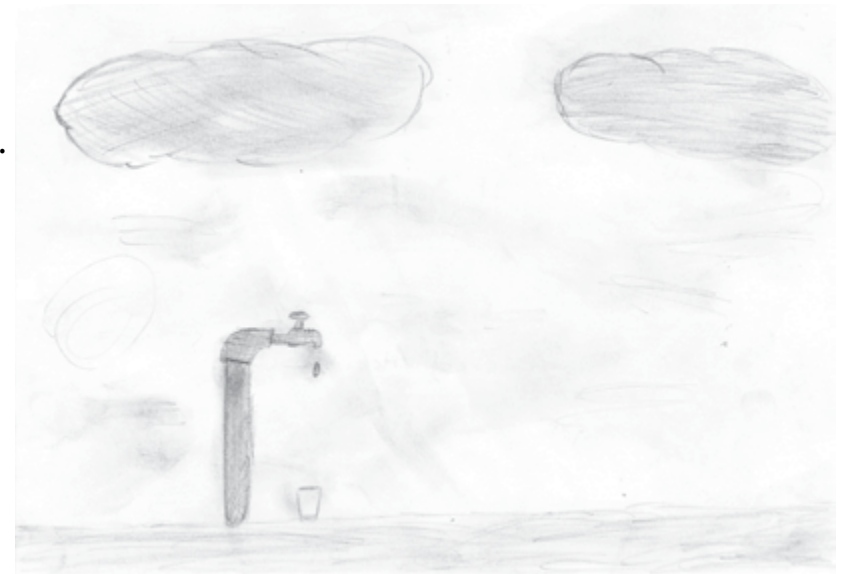

Amen.

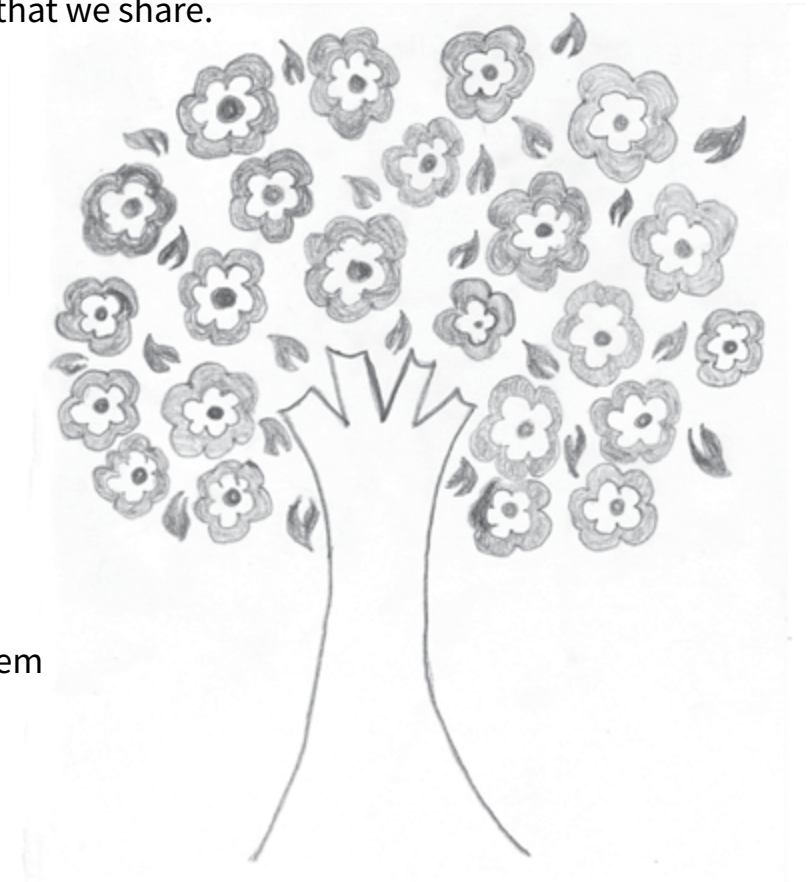

like those experiencing climate change in their country.

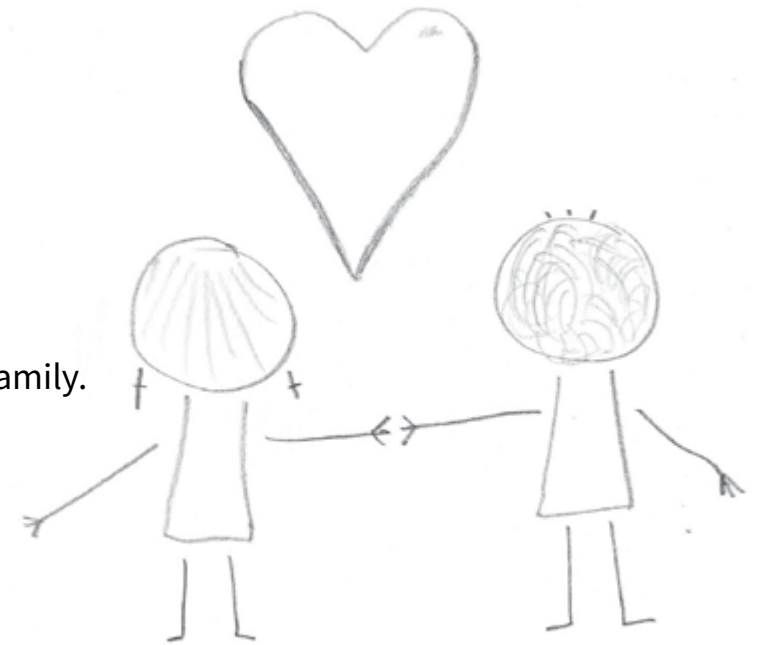
Please comfort those who are moving from their homelands

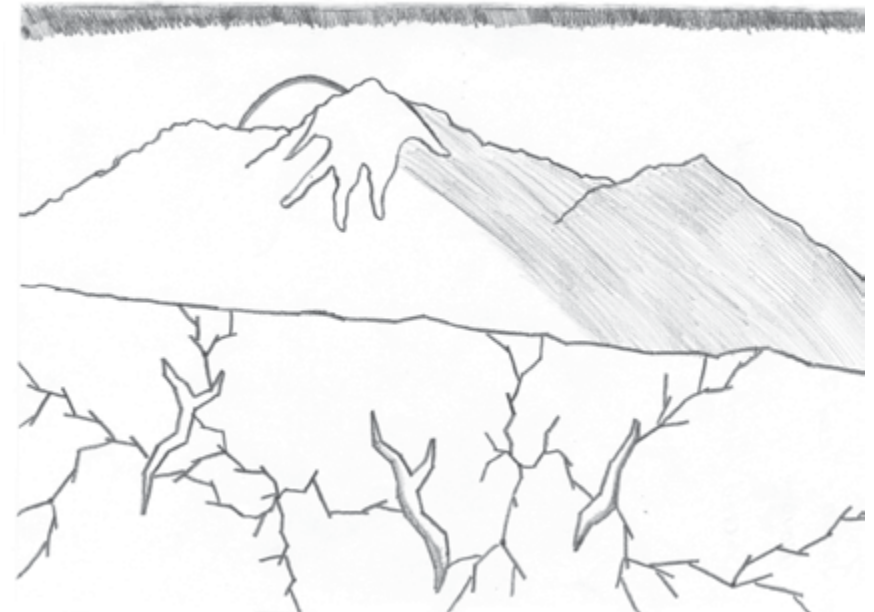
Prayer of Stewardship

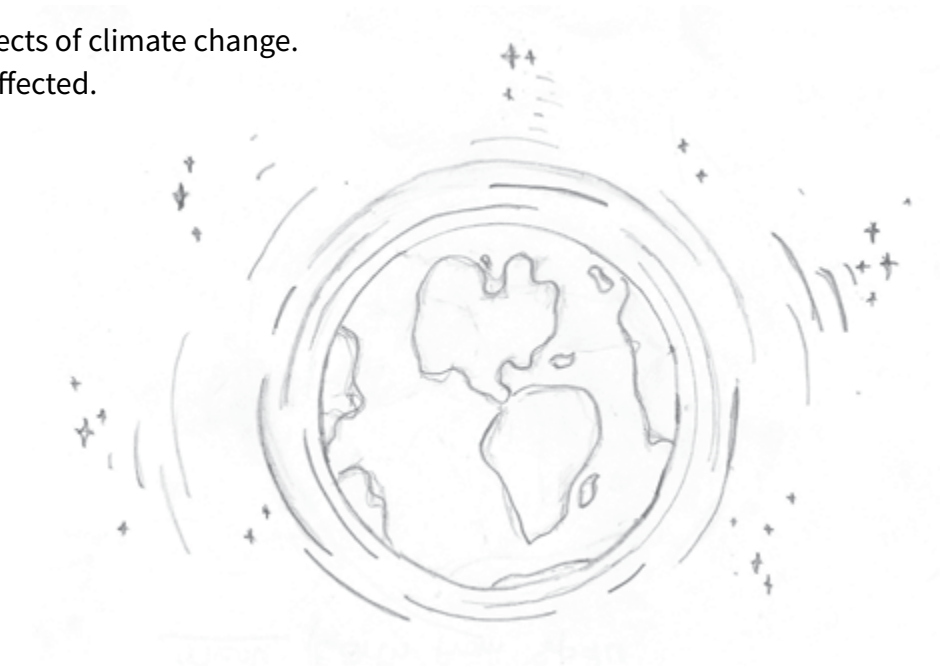

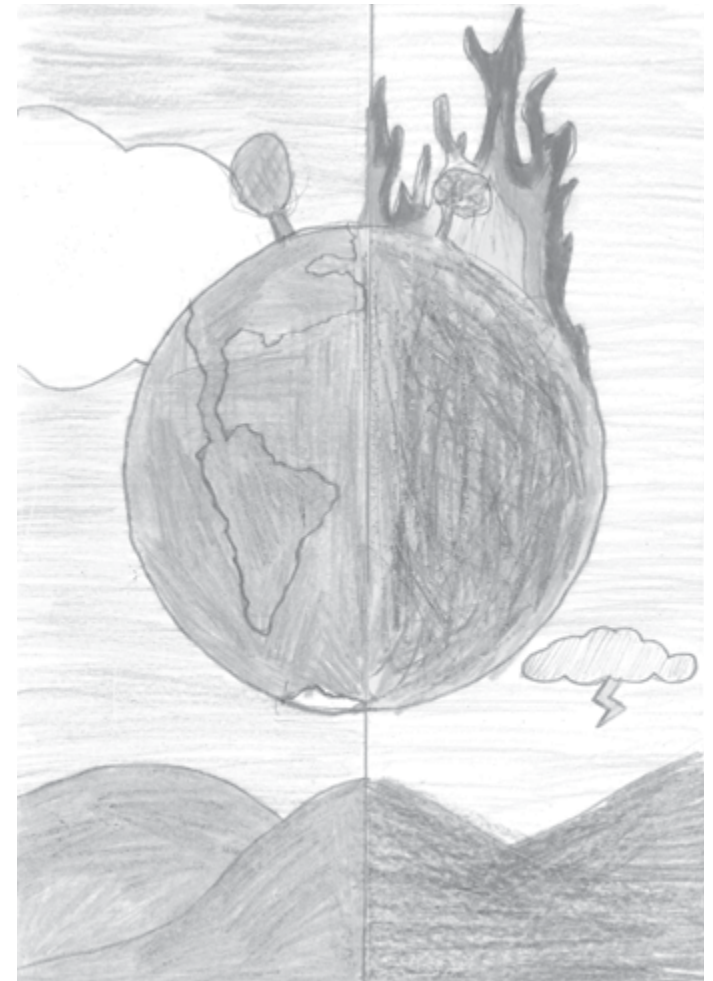

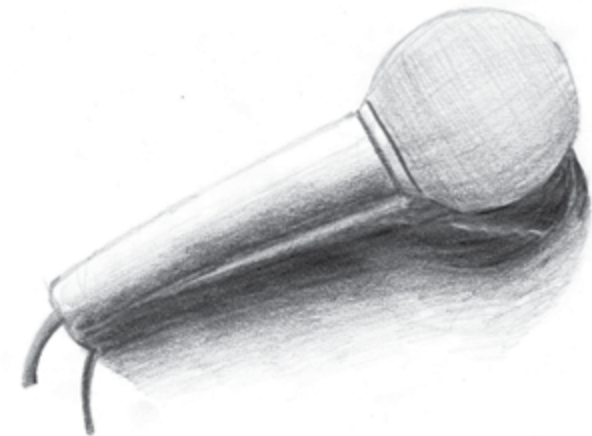
Climate Change

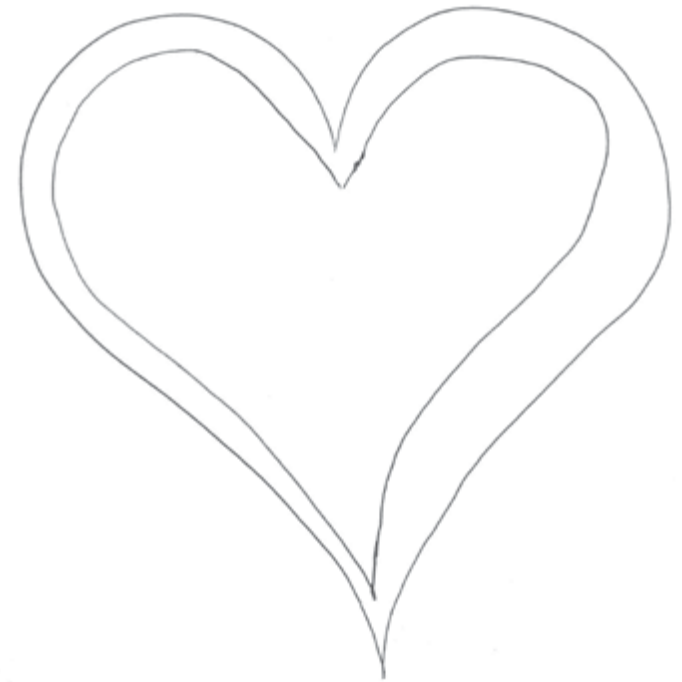
